Articulation Agreement

and

Lake Superior State University

for

The School of Nursing Bachelor of Science in Nursing, BSN

Scope of Program:

Bay Mills Community College (BMCC) and Lake Superior State University (LSSU) for its School of Nursing agree to establish a cooperative agreement of pre-nursing/nursing education by which BMCC students completing the Health Science associate degree at BMCC will receive one additional point towards acceptance into LSSU's Bachelor of Science in Nursing. This agreement shall become effective upon the last dated signature 11/30/2022

Program Articulation:

This articulation is intended for students seeking a Bachelor of Science in Nursing at Lake Superior State University. Students completing the Associate of Science in Health Science at Bay Mills Community College and earning a C or above in each course therein, will be eligible for one additional point to be added to the total score on the application to Lake Superior State University School of Nursing. Upon completion of the program courses and the meeting of all graduation requirements, Lake Superior State University will award a Bachelor of Science in Nursing. This degree will lead to a recommendation for the student to sit for the NCLEX and has, at the time of this agreement, a 3-year NCLEX-RN Pass Rate of 99.3%.

Responsibilities:

Bay Mills Community College agrees to:

- Engage in broad-based outreach to identify, recruit, and develop potential students in the Associate of Science in Health Science degree program and to monitor the progress of these students to ensure their continued qualification toward completion of the Associate of Science in Health Science
- 2. Advertise and make accessible this agreement to all current potential students at BMCC
- 3. Identify and engage BMCC students who are first generation college students, graduates from low-income high schools, PELL, or institutional need-based grant eligible or recipient, graduate of an underserved urban or rural area high school
- 4. Make LSSU School of Nursing application requirements known to students
- 5. Ensure continued course offerings for the appropriate academic preparation of students, for transfer to LSSU School of Nursing

- 6. Advise students to complete ED105, First Year Experience, and ES113, Sports Nutrition in addition to completion of the Associate of Science in Health Science degree
- 7. Facilitate engagement between students and LSSU School of Nursing advising and other developmental opportunities, including Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) preparation activities

Lake Superior State University agrees to:

- Communicate with BMCC regarding transfer expectations and transferable pre-nursing courses
- 2. Invite BMCC student participation in LSSU School of Nursing activities that develop/enrich pre-nursing and nursing students, including Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) preparation activities
- 3. Grant one additional point to graduates of BMCC Associate of Science in Health Science, earning a C or better in courses therein, toward acceptance to LSSU School of Nursing Bachelor of Science in Nursing
- 4. Assign a Nursing Academic Advisor to identify and offer advising and academic support to transfer students who are first generation college students, graduates from low-income high schools, PELL or institutional need-based grant eligible or recipient, graduate of an underserved urban or rural area high school
- 5. Ensure continued course offerings for Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree completion
- 6. Permit BMCC students to self-identify for consideration as a pre-nursing student
- 7. Grant a baccalaureate degree to each nursing student upon successful completion of LSSU graduation requirements

Program Publicity:

Both institutions agree that all program materials, media releases, and interview comments concerning this articulation agreement shall be mutually approved prior to publication, release, or comment, which such approval will not be unreasonably withheld. Both institutions agree that all program materials will be made available to both institutions for use and distribution upon request.

Length of Agreement:

The parties commit to a review every two years. The agreement shall be reviewed in the spring of 2025. Upon satisfactory review of the agreement conditions and effectiveness, the agreement may be renewed through a new agreement or amendment. The agreement may be suspended or revoked only upon written request by either institution with sixty (60) day advance notice to: an administrative representative from BMCC and an administrative representative from LSSU. Should either institution provide a written request for suspension or revocation, any student currently in progress toward the Associate of Science in Health Sciences at BMCC shall be permitted to continue.
